Award Winning Spanish Thriller Makes North American Home Video Debut

(Philadelphia, July 13, 2004) **BOX 507** (La Caja 507) makes its' home video debut as part of the TLA Releasing International Film Festival on July 13th, 2004. The video retails for \$24.99 in DVD and VHS formats. The gripping thriller directed by Enrique Urbizu, can be purchased at the TLA Video Web site at a discount – www.tlavideo.com – or through such major retailers as Amazon.com, Borders Books and Music, Transworld, Musicland and Virgin Megastores.

FILM

A gripping, unpredictable crime thriller full of intrigue and style in the tradition of CHINATOWN and Hitchcock, **BOX 507** is set along Spain's wealthy Costa del Sol. A band of professionals rob a bank managed by Modesto (Antonio Resines), who eventually gets locked in the safe-deposit vault. Battered, dazed and waiting to be rescued, he stumbles across a box numbered 507, which could hold the answers to the mysterious death of his daughter seven years ago. Along with Rafael (José Coronado), who he may or may not trust, Modesto begins to piece together clues becoming entangled in a web of foul play and corruption. With a taste for vengeance, our protagonist encounters harsh violence from the police and a government that is "hellbent" on keeping secrets buried.

CAST & CREW

Enrique Urbizu (Director/co-writer) With eight features to his credit, Urbizu has directed comedies and dramas, but his forte is the thriller, creating such films as *CACHITO*, *INFIDELITY* and *ANYTHING FOR BREAD*. **BOX 507**, garnered four nominations at the 2003 Goya Awards, winning two statuettes. The film was also awarded the 2003 Sant Jordi Award for Best Picture, the 2002 Ondas Award for Best Director, and swept the 2003 Cognac Festival of Crime Drama with the Critics Award, Grand Prix, Premiere Award and Special Prize.

Antonio Resines (Modesto) Multi-award winning actor has appeared in over 100 films in his native Spain including *MUTANT ACTION*, directed by Alex de la Iglesia (*800 BULLETS*), *MOUTH TO MOUTH* with Javier Bardem and *ATAQUE VERBAL*, which is directed by Miguel Albaladejo (*BEAR CUB*). In 1998, Resines received a Best Actor Goya for his role in *LUCKY STAR*.

CAST & CREW (continued)

José Coronado (Rafael) Nominated for his role in **BOX 507** at the 2003 Goya Awards, Coronado is familiar to North American audiences with his role in **THE DISAPPEARANCE OF GARCIA LOCA**, starring Andy Garcia and Edward James Olmos. He also portrayed a young version of artist, Francisco Goya, in the sumptuous film **GOYA**, which he was also nominated for a Goya Award in 2000.
